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July 22, 2025 Meeting

MINUTES

The meeting, conducted via Microsoft Teams, was called to order at approximately 10:25 am., and the following business was conducted in Board of Claims matters.

After Director Hardesty delivered the monthly report for the Board of Claims for June 2025, the June Minutes were approved. Chairman Wright moved to approve the June Minutes with Member Sights seconding. Having majority in favor, the Motion carried.
