MINUTES

The meeting, conducted via Zoom, was called to order at approximately 10:00 am., and the following business was conducted in Board of Claims matters.

Newly appointed member, Kathryn Thomas, was sworn in prior with Staff Attorney Natalie Lile administering the oath. In attendance were Board members Samuel Wright, Dale Sights, and Kathryn Thomas. Chairman Wright called the meeting to order.

A quorum existed and business was conducted. Also in attendance were Executive Director John Hardesty, Staff Attorneys Shelby Bevins-Sullivan and Natalie Lile, Clerk Katie Dean, Hearing Officers Eden Davis Stephens and Shawn D. Chapman, Attorney Sarah Noble for Tourism, Arts & Heritage Cabinet, Attorney Kevin Imhof for Claimant Tradewater Organics, LLC, Attorney Desmond Fitzgerald for Claimant Soojin Conover, Attorney Jerry Patton for Claimant Romeo Delrosario, and Claimants Sandra Windgassen, Jerry Marstall, Soojin Conover, and James Lawson.

After Executive Director Hardesty delivered the monthly report for the Board of Claims for April 2023, the April Minutes were approved. Member Dale Sights moved to approve the April 2023 Minutes with Chairman Wright seconding. Having all in favor, the Motion carried.

BC-23-0109: Theresa Monroe v. Justice & Public Safety Cabinet, Dept. of Public Advocacy (DPA)

1st: Kathryn Thomas 2nd: Dale Sights. Having all in favor, the motion carried.

• The Board sustained the DPA's Motion to Dismiss.

BC-23-0113: Theresa Monroe v. Office of the Bell County Commonwealth's Attorney

1st: Kathryn Thomas 2nd: Dale Sights. Having all in favor, the motion carried.

• The Board sustained the Respondent's Motion for Summary Disposition.

BC-23-0114: <u>Theresa Monroe v. Justice & Public Safety Cabinet, Kentucky State Police (KSP)</u> 1st: Kathryn Thomas 2nd: Dale Sights. Having all in favor, the motion carried.

• The Board sustained KSP's Motion to Dismiss.

At approximately 10:57 am, Chairman Wright moved to enter an Executive Session pursuant to KRS 61.815 and KRS 61.810(1)(c) and (j) to deliberate on the following cases: BC-23-0121, BC-22-0918, BC-23-0109, BC-23-0113, BC-23-0114, BC-21-0518, BC-22-0028, and BC-20-0469. Member Sights seconded. Having all in favor, the Board went into Executive Session.

At approximately 11:44 am, Member Thomas moved to exit the Executive Session and return to Open Session. Member Sights seconded. Having all in favor, the motion carried, and no official action was taken during the Executive Session.

BC-22-0896: Louisville Gas & Electric Company v. KYTC
